

# Bean Bag Tic-Tac-Toe

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**Grade Level:** K-12

**Learning Objectives:**

- The student will practice proper technique for the underhand throw.
- The student will follow all applicable rules while participating in this activity.
- The student will work cooperatively in a group and maintain proper personal responsibility.
- The student will use proper social support.

**Space Needed:**

- A large, flat area is best; such as a cafeteria, or blacktop.

**Equipment & Materials Needed:**

- Stickers
- Colored marking tape or chalk
- Bean bags, 4-5 per student of opposite colors.

**Set-Up:**

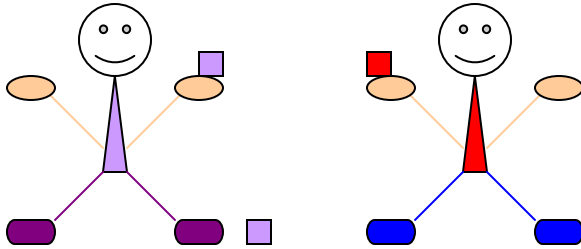
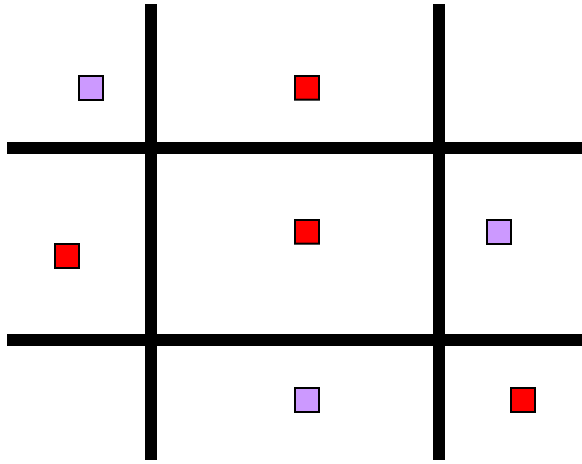
- Tape or draw the Tic-Tac-Toe Board on the floor.
- Prior to the activity, place one (1) sticker on the student's dominant hand & the other sticker on the opposite foot. \*This will help them step with the correct foot while underhand tossing with the opposite hand



**Description of Learning Activities:**

- Students should be pairs.
- Have each pair go to one of the Tic-Tac-Toe Boards.
- Each student has their own color bean bag, i.e. one student has red, while the other has blue.
- The object is to get three beanbags in a row, across, down, or diagonal.
- Students step and throw with stickered hand and foot. Please see "Underhand Throwing Pattern for proper throwing technique.
- When there is a "winner" the students should SIT-DOWN.

**Authentic Assessment:**

- Peers observe one another they are throwing and give feedback as to proper throwing technique.
- Teacher observation of students' social support and cooperation during the activity.
- Teacher may use a check list to determine each student's throwing assessment.
