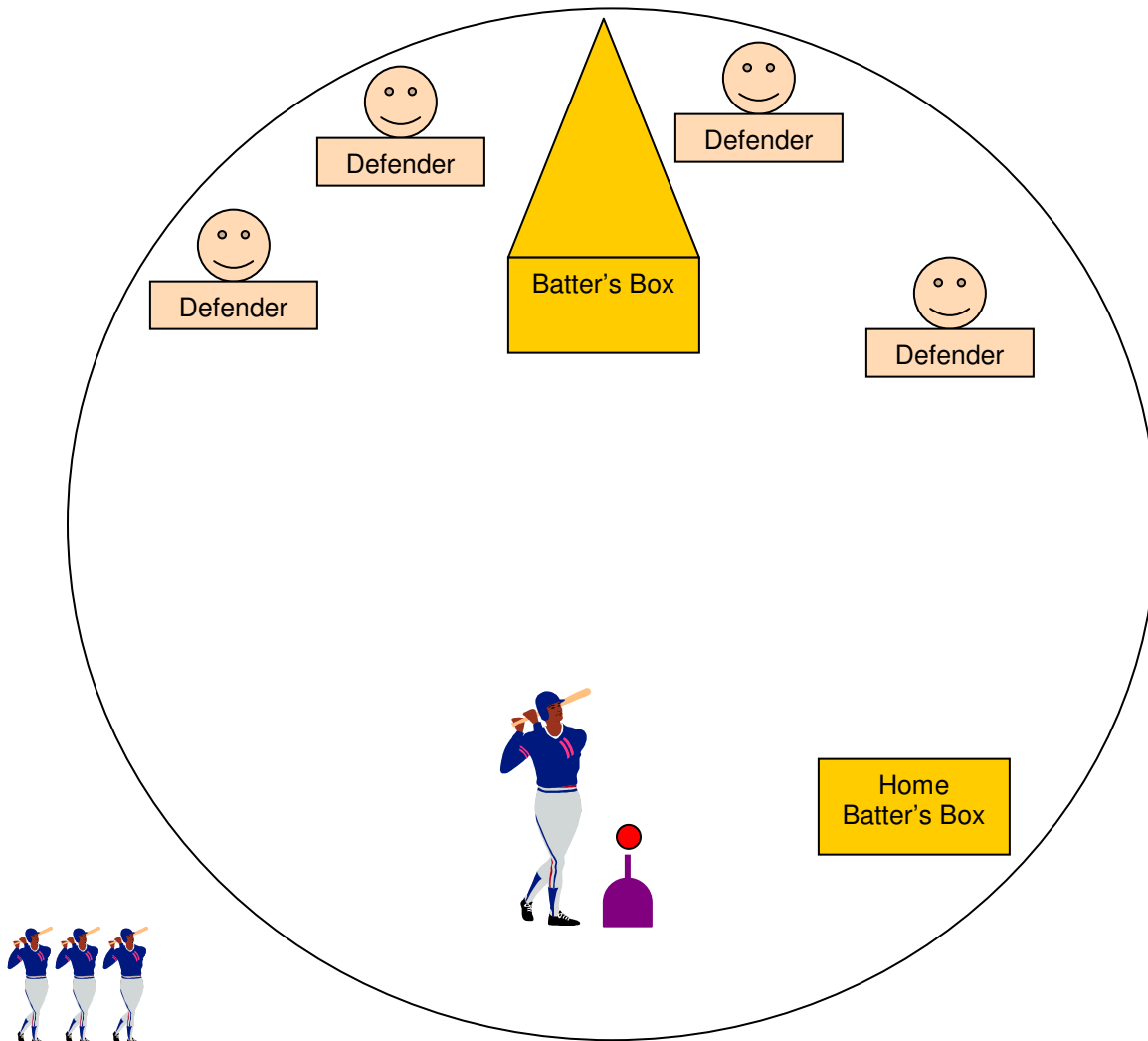


## Modified Cricket



- There is one (1) batter, in the batter's box.
- Batter hits the ball off the wicket (cone), using the flat bat, similar to a golf swing, not a softball swing; bat is kept low.
- May hit the ball in any direction; if the ball goes outside of the playing area it is an automatic out.
- Once the ball is hit, the batter runs to the opposite wicket (cone), and stays in the batter's box.
- Defense gets the offense out, by touching the wicket with the ball while the batter is outside of the batter's box.
- Each time the batter has safely moved to the opposite wicket/batter's box, their team scores a run.
- New batter comes in, after an out, a hit, or a score.
- If there is a runner in the opposite batter's box, they may run to the home batter's box, only once the batter gets a hit, which will count as a run.
- The runner may get out if the defense touches the wicket with the ball before they cross over the home batter's box.
- Four (4) batters up (or until the entire team has batted), then rotate defense and offense.
