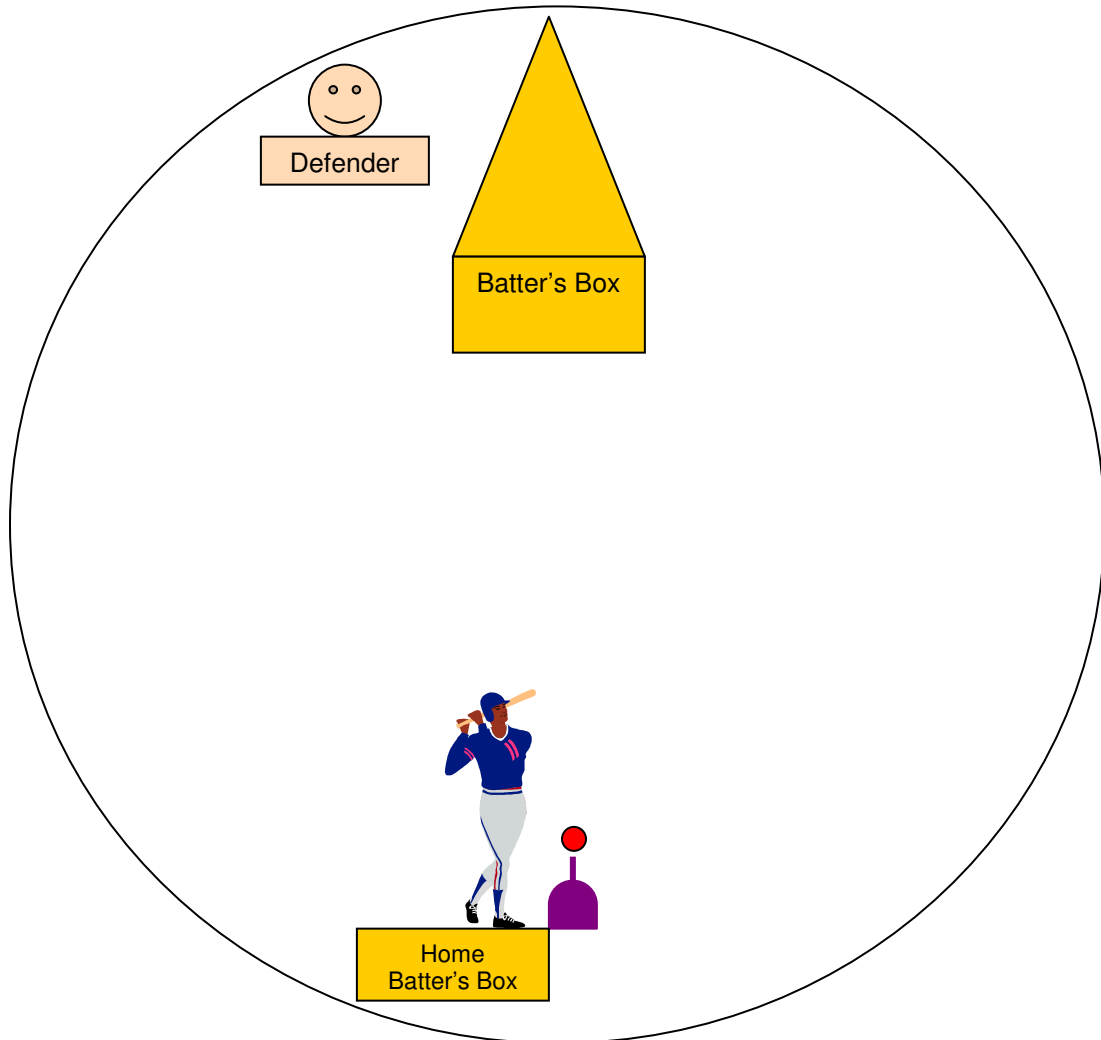


## One-on-One Cricket



- There is one (1) batter, in the batter's box.
- Batter hits the ball off the wicket (cone or batting T), using the flat bat, similar to a golf swing, not a softball swing; bat is kept low.
- May modify swing and use the Batting Sequence rather than golf-type swing.
- Bat may be anything: regular bat, XL bat, tennis racquet, paddle, etc.
- Once the ball is hit, the batter runs to the opposite wicket (cone or batting-T), and touches the cone.
- Batter must run with the bat (or striking implement) and touch using the implement.
- Defense gets the offense out, by touching the wicket (cone or batting-T) with the ball before the batter touches it.
- Each time the batter has safely touched the wicket (cone or batting-T), they score a run (or point).
- After each hit (or turn), the batter and the defense switch places regardless of the outcome.
